

## GOOD JUDGMENT – FIFTH GRADE

**Book and Lesson will be together in the media center. Materials are in the cabinet immediately to your left when you enter the media center.**

### **Materials:**

Book- *Enemy Pie* by Derek Munson

### **Activity:**

Lead discussion with students: What does good judgment mean?

-making good choices

-thinking before you act

Examples- coming to school, taking care of our bodies, listening to the teacher, following directions

Display definition and read aloud

Introduce book, *Enemy Pie* by Derek Munson

Show the cover of the book. Ask students to make a prediction. What will this book be about?

Read *Enemy Pie*, stopping periodically to discuss.

After reading the story, ask the class:

What was the Enemy Pie recipe? Cherry pie!

Why did his dad want him to spend the day with his enemy, Jeremy Ross? (to see that he is not an enemy, they would have fun together, to get along)

What do you think would happen if you spent a day with someone you were not getting along with?

### **Questions:**

How does this story connect with our character trait Good Judgment?

Students can share times they showed good judgment and were able to think before they acted, or had to make a difficult decision. (Playing to friends, coming to school, using good problem solving skills, when they are angry or have strong feelings)
